
# **FIRST** CALIFORNIANS





Students will explore the history and technique of Native American basketry. Students will learn a beginner weaving process using various synthetic fiber materials and wheat straw bowls. Using these materials, they will focus on color and patterns based on their experience of Native American basketry from the First Californians exhibit. Students will also apply beading and feathers to their baskets, inspired by the effects of trade between Nations and European cultures on Native American basketry.
