Global Threads Exhibition Weaves a New Chapter at Bowers Museum



Santa Ana, CA – November 5, 2025 – This winter, Bowers Museum unveils Global Threads: India's Textile Revolution, an exhibition that brings to life the dazzling story of Indian cotton textiles that reshaped the world's fashion, trade, and culture. Opening December 13, 2025, the exhibition explores how painted and printed cottons from India—known as chintz—sparked global revolutions in art and industry, connecting artisans, merchants, and designers across four continents for over a thousand years.

Featuring more than 100 stunning

works from the Royal Ontario Museum (Toronto, Canada) and private collections, *Global Threads* reveals India's profound legacy as the world's textile innovator. From palace-sized fabrics and 13th-century dye fragments to couture by contemporary designers, visitors will discover how these textiles continue to inspire today's global fashion world.
